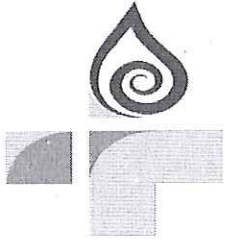

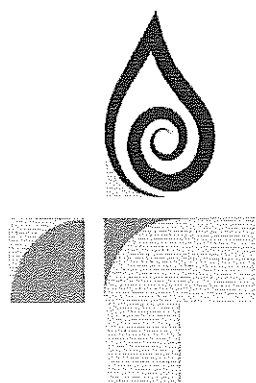

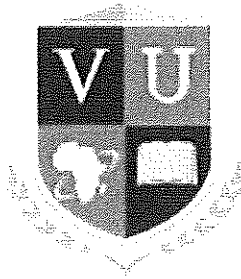
Wells of Hope Ministries Activity

BRIEF REPORT

Wells of Hope is a Christian organization that was started in 2010. Its mission is to take care of children whose parents are in prison, others whose parents died in prison or in prison but living with HIV/AIDS. Wells of Hope organizes youth camps every end of term to empower the children as they break off for their holidays.

On the 29th of August 2015, we, five students from Victoria University (Apolot Winnie, Mariam Jiwani, Victoria Olubowale, Rebecca Suubi and Maria Ssematiko), attended the youth camp at Wells Hope which had begun on the 28th of August 2015. The youth camp we were a part of comprised of pupils in primary six and seven, students from senior one to four who were 42 in total. Among those invited were One Hope Uganda and Victoria University.

We had a session with the children, gave health education talks concerning the following different topics;

-Sex education and relationships

- Knowing God and not losing hope
- Alcohol drugs and addiction
- Priorities and how to achieve in life (dreams)

After that we had a tour around the Wells of Hope premises. We were shown students' class rooms, dormitories and sustainability projects which comprised of small scale poultry farming, cattle keeping, piggery, and maize gardening. These sustainability projects are one of the ways which the organization uses as a means to meet daily needs for the children.

The tour guide highlighted some of the challenges that Wells of Hope faces and these include a lack of enough funds to run the organization, limited accommodation for the children, limited infrastructure and the poor furnishing of the classrooms. She reported that some of the children sit on the floor during lessons in class. Lastly the staff of Wells of Hope is not well paid due to lack of enough funds.

Before leaving, we played bonding games with the children which helped us interact more with the children, get to know each other and we made friends. Then we handed over the items that we had to offer and that was a day very well spent.

What we appreciated the most at the youth camp was playing with the children and meeting new youth workers from different organizations with them. However, we also noted the deep set hurt the children have experienced at such a tender age. Some of them appeared as though they were carrying burdens of sorrow and guilt on their backs.

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

The visit was educational yet inspirational. We had a great time thanks to the staff of Wells of Hope and the Heads of the faculty of Health sciences Victoria University for granting us this opportunity. We would like to be a part of many more health outreaches to impact our community and country at large.


